# Shiloh Road Project Update



In case you missed it, the Shiloh Road project is still underway and making progress each week. On July 25, the City of Garland Engineering Department installed a 145-foot-long signal bridge. It weighs approximately 40,000 pounds.

The purpose of the signal bridge is to eliminate the various poles throughout the intersection and allow for a better line of sight to the signals and increase safety. As of now, the Shiloh Road project is about 50% complete.

In August we expect to start paving at various locations, including the Kingsley intersection, Oakland Street and McCree Road.

The project is approximately three months behind, primarily due to weather and unforeseen utility conflicts. The latest schedule from the contractor has us completing the job in March 2021.

## Naaman School Road Project Update

The City of Garland will reconstruct Naaman School Road from a two-lane roadway into a four-lane divided street stretching from Brand Road to State Highway 78 (Lavon Avenue). This plan includes raising the road over Spring Creek, while creating an enclosed storm drain system and a hiking trail along the north side of the roadway. This project will alleviate road congestion by providing twice the number of travel lanes in each direction and alleviate flooding issues during significant rainfall.



The Naaman School Road project is currently in the design phase and anticipated to start construction in early 2022. For more information, visit [buildgarland.com](http://buildgarland.com)
